At the end of the review you will all agree your targets for the year to help you work towards your hopes and dreams.



What will happen after the review?

By the end of your review everyone will have agreed on an Action Plan. The Action Plan will make sure that everyone can see what they need to do to help you learn.

The Action Plan will say:

- the help you want and need to learn
- who will make sure you get this help
- when, where and how often you will get this help

After the review you will be able to read the Action Plan and talk about it with your family and friends.

Information for children and young people

What is a person-centred review?

In your review you, your family and other people who support you will talk about how to help you. You will be able to tell everyone what is important to you now and in the future, what is going well for you and what you would like to change in your life.



Who will be at the review?

You are the most important person, so we would love for you to be there. You will have a voice in all the decisions that are made.



You can invite people who are important to you, such as family members, friends and people who help you in school.

There could also be some other people there who help you, like a Speech and Language Therapist.

There may be lots of people there or just you, someone from your family and someone from your school.

Where and when will it be held?

Your review will probably be held at your school. Someone will help you to plan your review. You can decide together where it will be and when it will happen. You can send out invites to the people you want to be there.

How can you get ready for the review?

This leaflet can be used to help you get ready for your review.

There is also a sheet for you to write down the things you would like to say during the review and any questions you may have.

If you are not going to stay for the whole review, then it is important that your voice is still heard. You can write down your views on the sheet you have been given and give it to your teacher.

What will happen at the review?

Your review will give everyone a chance to talk about how well you have done this year. You can choose where people sit. You can choose to have music playing or to offer snacks and drinks, such as your favourite biscuits.



Someone from school will lead your review. They will make sure that everyone's views are listened to, including yours.

The conversation will start with everyone saying their name and saying what they like about you.

Everyone will be able to share their ideas. You will talk about what is important to you and how everyone can best support you.

You will talk about what you are happy and unhappy with in your life. You will also talk about your hopes and dreams for the future and what you would like to achieve.
